Principal's Message:

Ngā mihi nui ki te whānau ō Onewhero,

I had the opportunity to get out and about around Franklin to catch up with a number of our sports teams on the weekend. It was great to see the high level of competition and success that our students were achieving but mostly it was great to see people out there enjoying being a part of a team and having fun with their mates. The level of sportsmanship on display was excellent, sometimes in trying circumstances in the face of intimidation and unsportsmanlike behaviour from the other teams. I was proud of our students and supporters, too.

Following on from the sport, our students enjoyed many successes at the Franklin Music Competitions held over the weekend. I don't have all of the details at this stage but I do know that there were a number of major trophies won by OAS students and many more medals. When I have more detail I will publish these results.

With regard to the 2018 Calf Club, thanks to all who filled out the survey. The results were about 55% in favour of continuing as normal. However, since then I have received further advice from MPI, which advises against having calves at school this year. It is just not worth the risk to our farms in the area. Other schools in the area have made the same decision. Therefore, Onewhero Area School will still hold Calf Club day in 2018 but we will not be allowing calves. Please consider rearing another animal this year. I would be happy to discuss this with you if you have any further questions or concerns.

Last week on the teacher only day staff had a productive day of professional learning. A large group of staff travelled to Ngatea to visit Ngatea Primary, which has gone down a pathway of student ownership for their learning. Here is their story here:
